Accessibility Laws

Americans with Disabilities Act:

Covers facilities that provide sleeping accommodations that are primarily short-term.

UNITED STATES ACCESS BOARD

Americans with Disabilities Act:

Certain facilities used for transient lodging such as time shares and dormitories may also be considered residential and covered by the Fair Housing Act.

Current ADA Standards



Option:

DOJ's 2010 standards (mandatory March 15, 2012)

OR

DOJ's 1991 standards (until March 15, 2012)



UNITED STATES ACCESS BOARD

Architectural Barriers Act:

Covers transient lodging facilities that are designed, constructed, altered, or leased by, or on behalf of the United States.

Current ABA Standards (Federal facilities)



Similar standards in effect for all federally facilities (DOD, GSA, and USPS)



HUD Facilities – UFAS still applies (**HUD to update standards**)


Rehabilitation Act:

Covers facilities that are a program of Federal agency or that are constructed or altered with Federal financial assistance.

New ADA (and ABA) Standards



Based on the Board's ADA-ABA Guidelines (2004)

DOJ includes several additional requirements/ revisions

Additional DOJ Requirements



In DOJ's updated ADA regulations: Application of scoping provisions to sites with multiple facilities:

- 50 or less guest rooms may be combined
- 50 or more guest rooms shall be scoped separately

Additional DOJ Requirements



In DOJ's updated ADA regulations:

Alterations to guest rooms where room interiors are controlled by individual owners are not required to comply with alteration standards or section 224.1.1.

Residential dwelling units that are designed and constructed for residential use exclusively are not subject to the transient lodging standards.

Additional DOJ Requirements

In DOJ's updated ADA regulations:

Housing at a place of education is covered as transient lodging and <u>not</u> as residential. This will include University dormitories.




Additional DOJ Requirements

In DOJ's updated ADA regulations:

Facilities with more than 50 beds that provide common use bathing facilities shall provide at least one roll-in shower with a seat that complies with the relevant provisions of section 608 of the 2010 Standards.

Transient Lodging Scoping

Transient Lodging Guest Rooms ADA Scoping

Section 224.2

• Mobility Features:

New Construction - based on the number of rooms provided.

Alterations - The minimum required to be accessible is based on the total number altered or added.

UNITED STATES ACCESS BOARD

Shower and Tub Scoping

- Transient lodging facilities with 50 or less rooms are required to provide no fewer than one water closet, one lavatory and one bathtub.
- Transient lodging facilities with more than 50 rooms are required to provide no fewer than one water closet, one lavatory and one roll-in shower.

Guest Room Doors and Doorways Scoping

Section 224.1.2

A 32 inch minimum clear opening width is required for all guest room entrances, doors, and doorways.

This section contains an exception for shower and sauna door.

Guest Room Beds Scoping

Section 224.3

 Where a guest room equipped with mobility features has more than 25 beds 5% of the beds must have a 30 inches minimum by 48 inches minimum clear floor space on both sides of the bed.

Section 224.4

• Communication Features:

New Construction - based on the number of rooms provided.

Alterations - The minimum required to be accessible is based on the total number altered or added.

Section 224.5

• Dispersion:

Guest rooms providing mobility features and guest rooms providing communication features must be dispersed among the various types of guest rooms.

Accessible Route Scoping

Sections 206

At least 1 accessible route is required to:

- accessible guest rooms and the elements and spaces with the room
- accessible parking
- all public use and common use area serving the facility
- all guest room doors into and within the facility except shower and sauna doors



Components of Transient Lodging Guest Rooms

Transient Lodging Components

Guest Rooms with Mobility Features:

- At least one accessible route shall connect all spaces that are part of the guest room
- Accessible living and dining areas
- A sleeping area with clear floor space on both sides of the bed
- One accessible bathroom
- Turning space within the guest room




