- Purpose and Programs

Older Americans Act Administration on Aging. Establishes the Administration on Aging, the Aging Network Title II Aging Network Support Grants for State and Community Programs on Aging. Authorizes community supportive services in five Title III Community Programs different areas Title V Community Service Employment for Older Americans. Employment Title VI Grants for Native Americans. Native Americans Title VII Vulnerable Elders Vulnerable Elder Rights Protection Activities.


