

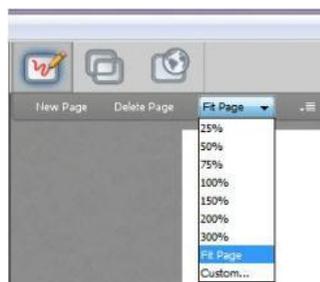

## Customize Your View

- Resize the Whiteboard where the Presentation slides are shown to make it smaller or larger by choosing from the drop down menu located above and to the left of the whiteboard. The default is “fit page”

## Customize Your View *continued*

## Setting Preferences

- commercial facilities



# ABA Standards


Apply to facilities:

## ADA v. ABA Standards

### Differences – ADA Standards:

- **Equivalent facilitation (§103)/ ABA Standards: Modifications & waivers (§F103)**
- **Limited access to work areas (§203.9)**
- **Exceptions for vertical access between stories in private sector facilities (§206.2.3)**

## ADA v. ABA Standards

- **DOJ's ADA Standards**: additional provisions for assembly areas (221), medical care facilities (223), transient lodging (224), detention/ correctional facilities (232), dwelling units & social service establishments (233)
- **DOT's ADA Standards**: revised provisions for accessible routes (§206.3), bus stops/stations (§810.2.2), rail station platform (§810.5.3), and curb ramps (§406.8)

## ADA v. ABA Standards

### Differences – ABA Standards:

- **Stricter requirements for additions (§F202.2)**
- **Scoping requirements for leased facilities (§F202.6)**
- **Requirements for outdoor developed areas on federal lands (§F244 - §F248, §1011 – §1019)**
