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

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Employee Work Area §106.5 & F106.5

“All or any portion of a space used only by employees and used only for work. Corridors, toilet rooms, kitchenettes and break rooms are not employee work areas.”



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Work Areas §203.9

Access for "approach, entry, & exit"

- Door maneuvering clearance (exterior)
- Compliant door (clear width, hardware, opening force, etc.)
- Clear floor space



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
Janitor's Closets



- Employee work area
- < 1,000 sf – approach, enter, and exit (203.9)
 - 1,000 sf or larger – common use circulation path (206.2.8)

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Laboratories



University laboratories used by graduate students not employee work areas


Sinks §212.3 & F212.3



- 5% of each type in each accessible space
- Mop or service sink exception

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Laboratories



- Work surfaces - 5% and dispersed throughout (226 & F226)
- Cabinet storage (225 & F225)

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Ticket and Service Counter



- Roll-up door operated by employee only – provisions do not apply

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Operability



- 1 hand operation
- No tight grasping, pinching, or twisting of wrist
- 5 lb. maximum



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Operability

Closed fist operation = good, but not mandatory
Many other types comply (e.g., U-shaped pulls)





At least one accessible route to building entrances from site arrival points provided



parking & passenger loading zones



streets & sidewalks



transportation stops

Accessible route not required where only means of access is vehicular way not providing pedestrian









- Height: 34" – 48" AFF (exception for certain existing doors and gates at pools)



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








Figure 502.2


- Planned scope of work (what you are touching)

Required where 6 or more compartments are provided or the combination of urinals and water closets totals 6 or more fixtures



- Width 35" – 37"
- Depth: 60" min.
- Self-closing door



- Replaced = new toilet must comply



(instead of 60" centerline)



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


